



## Notice of Study Completion

### King Township Transportation Master Plan

#### The Study

In 2020, the Township of King developed a Transportation Master Plan (TMP) to guide the planning and implementation of its multi-modal transportation network to the year 2031 and beyond. Since finalizing the previous TMP in 2020, a changing policy landscape and emerging new trends in transportation have resulted in the need for a new TMP. The Township has now planned an updated multi-modal transportation network to facilitate and support forecasted growth in population and employment to the year 2051.

The goal of the TMP is to help ensure that the transportation network can support future growth and allow people to travel by whatever mode they choose. The TMP also incorporates policies to support traffic calming, integrated land use planning, and community building. The TMP better reflects the changes in policy, strategy, and emerging practices and technologies that have occurred since the previous TMP.

#### Study Process

The TMP was completed in accordance with Approach #1 of the Master Plan process identified by the Municipal Engineers Association, fulfilling the requirements of Phase 1 and Phase 2 of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA).

#### The Report

The draft TMP report was presented to Council on December 8, 2025. It is being placed on the public record for a 30-day comment period in accordance with the MCEA process, beginning Friday June 26th, 2026. In addition, a request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order requiring a higher level of study (requiring an individual/comprehensive EA approval before being able to proceed), or that conditions be imposed (require further studies), only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered. Requests should include the requester's full name and contact information for the Ministry.



Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for conditions or for an individual/comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate or remedy potential adverse impacts, and any information in support of the statements in the request. This will ensure the Ministry is able to efficiently begin reviewing the request.
